Petitions and requests from the floor

Arthur Klafka 7025 Hillibrant Rd announced that he has been living on this road for 30 yrs. He beleived he knows Hillibrant Rd will be tar and chipped in the future but right now there is a lot of dust. Mr. Klafka requests maybe a temporary fix of millings or different pitching of the road for drainage issues as well. Mr. Klafka also requests that there be a speed limit posted of 30mph or less. They have spoken with a few people that travel on the dead-end road and requested they slow down; some people comply as others do not.

Mr. Weaver understands their issue and let them know that this is a capital project, and the road will be oiled and chipped next year. Weaver lets them know as well that it is a process to get the speed limit reduced and it will take some time, but the Town Board can start on the process. Mrs. Klafka let the board know that they also have drainage issues when storms hit, this went into further discussion.

June 8, 2021

Mr. McClory had said that the gravel will be going down in the next few weeks pending on weather and that could help the dust and the drainage as the road will rise. There will also be a salt brine that will be sprayed on the gravel for it to harden down, this road needed to be started from scratch as there was no base and needed the Capital project money to be able to build the road.

Mrs. Stone asked the Board if the guard rails will be put back in place. Mr. McClory stated once the gravel is hard enough then they can drive the posts back in. The guard rails have not gone back in yet because they would be at the wrong height if they put them in now.

Further discussion was had regarding which roads receive more attention than Hillibrant Rd as it has been passed over.

Supervisor Breton reminded the residents that there was no base at all and it is a dead-end rd, other roads are more traveled. He will start the process for the speed limit and the gravel that is being placed in the next few weeks will hopefully settle the dust.

Mr. Holden had a few questions as far as the building being cleaned. Mr. Tinelli asked if there was a task list that needed to be preformed and checked off. If not, we will make one and there are also a limit amount of hrs.

Highway Superintendent

Mr. McClory reported the department has been working on Hillibrant Rd preparing it for gravel. More ditch work and patching are being done on Trowbridge and Cemetery Hill Rd. The pay loader has been down, and 5 Star equipment is coming to haul it to their shop for repairs. Also, one of the dump trucks has been at Portville Truck for a month. Portville truck says because of Covid – 19 they are having a hard time receiving parts to fix the truck.

Mr. McClory said they will be patching Bryant Hill and the speed limit signs have been put into place. He also stated that the signs for the new boat launch are in place which include the Handicap, No fishing, and the No parking in the lower lot.


